FLU SEASON IS UPON US, and all students, faculty and staff are reminded to try to prevent the spread of flu as much as possible. The campus is working with the Sheboygan County Health Department to monitor flu conditions throughout the county and on the campus. The CDC recommends the following steps to prevent the spread of the virus: wash your hands with soap and water whenever possible, especially after coughing or sneezing (alcohol-based hand sanitizers have been installed around campus and also can help); cover your mouth and nose with a tissue when you cough or sneeze, or cough into your elbow or shoulder, avoiding your hands; avoid touching your face, nose, eyes, mouth, etc. as much as possible; know the signs of flu and stay home if you have the flu or a flu-like illness that includes a fever of 100 degrees or higher.
